Welcome to the vMLK website review. The vMLK website is hosted at vMLK dot chass dot NCSU dot edu. In this video, I will give you a quick walkthrough of the vMLK website. The top part of the vMLK website has the menu bar. The last option in the menu bar is search. In search, the search will enlist all the topics that have the keyword that you're looking for. For example, if I look for the keyword “listening,” it will enlist all the topics which have listening in their titles or content. I can jump to any of these topics from search.

The most important part of this website is the experience menu. The experience menu takes me to the different types of experiences of the project. These experiences are created or mimicked from the real-time experiences of the project. For example, in the virtual reality experience, we see three different videos. The three different videos simulations from audiences or from the perspectives of audiences who are navigating through the different corners of the church using the VR headset. Each of these videos shows these perspectives. For example, this is the video from the podium. [Applause heard from video] In other words, a person who is experiencing this project with a VR headset and has navigated to the podium will be seeing this particular video.

The pedagogical section has all the materials stored on that web page for easy access. The bottom of the home page enlists all the upcoming events related to the vMLK project. The pedagogy label is a shortcut to all the pedagogical resources. You can also jump to learn more about the project to this video on the experience page.
